### Outfitting an Atelier in Mine and Yours

Piet Boon, the Dutch architect and designer, recently opened a temporary studio at 404 Park Avenue South (28th Street), in a 1917 building that is being converted into 58 luxury apartments. Mr. Boon led the design team that outfitted the development, called Huys. He has furnished his atelier with his own creations, including Sam chairs upholstered in indigo fabric, shown with an oak Gerrit table. The studio also features other designers' works, like Roderick Vos's MaMa vase (on table), Frederik Molenschot's brass numeral sculptures (on wall) and a Great JJ floor lamp by Centro Stile in Italy (shown in white). Though these items cannot be purchased on site, Mr. Boon's staff can direct you to a dealer. The ground-floor space will be open until June, and then it will give way to a bank.
